













Abstract

From 3 to 5 October 2025, the CDA South-Holland and CDA Rotterdam will host a CDU delegation in Rotterdam for a three-day political exchange. The event focuses on strengthening cross-border cooperation, sharing ideas on key societal and political challenges, and deepening the relationship between both parties.

The programme includes political dialogue, work visits, a thematic conference, and cultural activities. It offers space for networking, reflection, and joint exploration of shared values in a European context.



Chapter I: Introduction

This year's jumelage between CDA South-Holland and CDU Kreis-Bonn, hosted by CDA Rotterdam, takes place at a time when the concept of resilience is more relevant than ever. Our cities are facing a multitude of challenges, including housing pressure, migration, social fragmentation, climate adaptation, polarisation, and economic insecurity. Yet it is precisely in these complex urban environments that the Christian Democratic worldview continues to offer a powerful and hopeful vision.

Rooted in a long tradition of personal responsibility, solidarity, and care for creation, Christian Democracy has always been about more than just policy. It is a way of strengthening the communities that make up society. We believe in strong communities, where people are not left to face difficulties alone, and in a government that supports without overwhelming them and empowers without abandoning them. In the face of hardship, resilience is found not only in infrastructure and governance but also in the moral and cultural strength of the people themselves.

Both the CDA and CDU emerged in postwar Europe as movements focused on social, economic, and spiritual reconstruction. Today, our task is similar in many ways. While the cities we serve are modern and diverse, the call remains the same: to bind what has been fragmented, to restore dignity where it has been lost, and to foster the quiet strength of everyday people.

This *jumelage* offers a space to exchange insights, deepen cooperation, and explore how Christian Democrats can shape the future of resilient cities and communities. These are cities that are not only livable, but also truly humane.
